Projects: Evacuation Routes	-Alternative contingency (evacuation) routes for Crestline/Birch Hill: Exit to East grade. County Evacuation initiative underway. Meeting with individual FSCs planned.
	1. Private road (32 J) loop from Crestline Rd through Borland's to Conifer Road and East Grade (S7) is passable with 4-wheel drive/small trucks. Low clearance vehicles would have difficulty and large emergency/fire vehicles can't get through. Gate at Conifer/East Grade secured with a lock. Needs improvement for 2 wheel drive vehicles and access of larger fire/emergency vehicles. Owner consent being sought for road improvement and roadside brushclearing. Per PMPO meeting: May need <i>new survey and new easement</i> for any segment involving road realignment outside current easement.
	2. Dirt track through Wall's property from Crestline to East grade is well graded, easily passable and well maintained by landowner.
	3. Old road from Birch Hill to East grade through private and USFS land would need to be cleared, graded and the final portion through USFS land drops off abruptly (6 ft) to East Grade and would need modification.
