Other	<p>Birch Hill resident raised concern re local evacuation notification especially at night and/or if cell phones not available. Only fire siren on mountain is at Fire Station 79. Additional remotely controlled sirens suggested in east at top of Birch Hill at Water company site and on west side (RC 's hill?)</p> <p>All residents should either have automatic Reverse 911 or sign up with Alert San Diego. For cell phone notification.</p>
