Birch Hill landowners contacted. In person. Almost all in agreement for roadside brushclearing but as above want to stay informed esp at time of brushclearing. Concerns re effect on retaining walls, removing large trees. Many trees on Birch Hill already marked for topping by SDG&E. (n.b., Funding is specifically for brushclearing only-not road improvement. Will use \$5,760 for 8 dumpsters; \$15,000 for 10 Community chipping days Defer purchase of Fire Gel as we still have 16 cases (home kits) in Conex storage container.
